CUHK International Summer School

The Chinese University of Hong Kong's International Summer School (ISS) provides you with an exceptional opportunity to combine high-quality learning with an unforgettable summer experience.

International Learning Environment

The ISS is open to local and international students; while attending, students can learn and live alongside other academic achievers from a range of cultures. International students can immerse themselves in a multicultural environment and gain insights into Asian cultures, experience a unique learning environment on the green, spacious campus of CUHK outside regular term time, and enjoy the many pleasures of summer in Hong Kong – Asia's world city. CUHK and local students can have a taste of cultural exchange with international students without going abroad.

In 2009, more than 600 students attended the ISS; 62% of them came from 30 places around the world. They made the programme truly international.

At the ISS, courses are taught by outstanding academics from CUHK and prestigious overseas universities. All of these academics are excellent teachers and many of them are frontrunners in research.

Cultural Programmes

Social cultural activities are organized to help international students discover Chinese and Hong Kong culture. These may include an orientation session to help them navigate around Hong Kong, as well as visits to cultural, tourist and historical sites, such as the Big Buddha and Victoria Peak.

China Tour (optional)

An optional four-day tour to Beijing, China will be held after the programme, leaving on 4 August and returning on 7 August. Participants will visit the major local attractions of Beijing, such as the Great Wall, the Forbidden City and Tiananmen Square.

Housing

Students who choose to reside on-campus will be housed in a student dormitory in double- or triple-occupancy rooms with shared bathroom facilities. Basic cooking facilities and communal facilities are also available.

Meals

For regular meals, students can choose to dine at one of the many student canteens located throughout the campus. Meals cost around HK\$20 to HK\$50 per meal.

International Summer School – Chinese Language Programme

The International Summer School – Chinese Language Programme (ISS-CLP) provides students with an opportunity to learn Putonghua and acquire pragmatic competence through lessons and immersion activities. It embraces language learning, cultural immersion, career preparation and entertainment and offers a remarkable experience for non-native Chinese learners.









All Putonghua courses are offered by outstanding university level language instructors of the Chinese Language Centre at CUHK, which is the only university unit in Hong Kong offering award-bearing Chinese programmes to both native and non-native speakers.

Levels 1 and 2 courses will comprise three weeks of intensive study at CUHK and immersion activities in Hong Kong; levels 3 and 4 courses will comprise two weeks of intensive study at CUHK and a one-week immersion programme in Guangzhou, China.

Immersion activities allow students to use language in real life for real communication purposes.

Students will form small groups and join different theme-based trips (visits or sightseeing), such as arts and culture, history and tradition.

China Tour (optional)

To let students have a taste of indigenous Chinese culture and journey through ancient and modern China, an optional 4-day-3-night tour to major cities in Southern China, such as Guangzhou, Zhaoqing , Zhongshan, Zhuhai and Shenzhen, will be held after the programme on 25-28 August 2010.



Students who choose to reside on-campus will be housed in a student dormitory in double- or triple-occupancy rooms with shared bathroom facilities. Basic cooking facilities and communal facilities are also available. Levels 3 and 4 students will be housed in a student dormitory at the host university in double- or triple-occupancy rooms with shared bathroom facilities during the immersion trip in Guangzhou, China.

- (1) The course fee is not applicable to exchange students nominated by CUHK's exchange partners.
- (2) The administrative fee covers the fees for a student visa to Hong Kong, orientation and some official activities, and reading materials.
- (3) The hostel fee covers air-conditioning and simple bedding but does not include a meal plan.
- (4) The immersion trip fee includes round trip transportation by train/coach/Catamaran to Guangzhou, China, and accommodation in a student dormitory (twin or triple room), welcome and farewell dinners, visit-related expenses, and local transportation.
- (5) Entry visa to mainland China, if required, and meals are at students' own expenses.

Admission
