The Harvard-Yenching Institute welcomes your continuing participation in its programs!

For the academic year 2014-15, your institution is invited to nominate up to a total of 5 candidates (3 for visiting scholars program and 2 for visiting fellows program maximum) from among your most promising faculty and students for application to our programs. In conjunction with the mission of the Harvard-Yenching Institute, nominated scholars must be working in the humanities and social sciences with an emphasis on culture. We seek outstanding scholars whose work is academic rather than applied. Scholars whose research focus is comparative, and includes one or more Asian countries, are especially welcome. We will continue the centralized interview process that was put in place a few years ago. In addition, we would like to remind you that although there is no age limit for applicants, preference will be given to younger scholars who are in the early stages of their academic career. We would greatly appreciate it if you could post the Harvard-Yenching Institute fellowship program information on your university web site for wide circulation.

The following is a summary of our programs:

Visiting Scholars Program

This program offers **faculty members in the humanities and social sciences** the opportunity to undertake 10 months of study and research at Harvard University and/or other appropriate universities. Approximately 10 to 15 applicants are chosen each year as researchers at the Harvard-Yenching Institute, and have access to the Harvard University libraries and facilities. Scholars are provided with living expenses while at the Institute. Applicants and university/academy administrators will be notified of selection results in mid-February, 2014. The selection criteria include English proficiency, academic training (including PhD degree in most cases), quality and originality of the research proposal, demonstrated depth of subject knowledge, and feasibility of conducting the research at Harvard University and/or other major universities in the United States. Selected scholars work with faculty at Harvard and/or other appropriate universities, and are required to make at least one public presentation in English on their proposed research project during their stay at the Institute.

The deadline for receipt of applications is **September 30, 2013**.

Visiting Fellows Program

This program provides **advanced Ph.D. candidates** (graduate students and junior faculty members) an opportunity to do dissertation research at Harvard University for three semesters, with access to Harvard University libraries and facilities. Fellows are also affiliated with the Graduate School of Arts and Sciences of Harvard University, and provided with living expenses while at the Institute. All applicants and university/academy administrators will be notified of selection results in mid-February, 2014. In our selection process, preference is given to advanced Ph.D. candidates working in East Asian Studies, especially with a comparative focus. The selection criteria include academic training, quality and originality of the research proposal, depth of subject knowledge and feasibility of conducting the research at Harvard University. Selected fellows study under the supervision of faculty at Harvard or other appropriate university, and participate in a weekly dissertation workshop. Please note that junior faculty members who have already obtained a doctorate are NOT eligible for this program.

The deadline for receipt of applications is **September 30, 2013**.

We ask that you send all of your completed applications via email in *PDF or word document* format, including letters of recommendation and the document of endorsement from the foreign affairs office, by September 30, 2013, in one package to the Harvard-Yenching Institute at the following address:

APPENDIX

1. Eligibility:

Visiting Scholars Program candidates should have been serving at their home university for at least two years as a full time faculty. Scholars who gained their PhD in an English speaking institution in the past five years are not eligible for applying for this program.

Visiting Fellows Program candidates should be doctoral students or junior faculty who are currently working on their dissertation research and writing. Junior faculty members who have already obtained a doctorate are NOT eligible to be nominated for this program.

2. Coverage of the scholarships:

The following is the detailed information on the fellowship coverage:

Visiting Scholars Program:

Round trip economy class airfare;

A stipend of US \$5,500 per month for the period of residence in Cambridge, Massachusetts (for 10 months);

Health Insurance;

Funding (up to \$1,000) for hiring a research Assistant within the 10-month research stay;

Funding (up to \$500.00) for one-time participation in an academic conference within the USA and Canada.

Visiting Fellows Program:

Round trip economy class airfare;

Payment of the Harvard University Visiting Fellows fee;

A stipend adequate for a single fellow (for 2013-14, the monthly stipend is approximately \$2,500);

Tuition for one English course for one semester at Harvard Extension School (not for a summer school course);

Funding (up to \$500.00) for one-time participation in an academic conference within the USA and Canada.

Harvard-Yenching Institute and RSEA Fellowship at Harvard University

The Harvard-Yenching Institute's Regional Studies (East Asia) Fellowship is for Asian nationals who plan to return to Asia to teach upon completion of their graduate studies. This is a multi-year full fellowship which covers the two-year master's degree in Harvard's RSEA program plus the first year of a doctoral degree program (in humanities or social sciences with a focus on East Asia) at an approved university. Nominations for this fellowship are made by Harvard University Ph.D. programs and/or the Regional Studies (East Asia) admissions committee. In addition to direct applicants to the RSEA program, nominees may include applicants to PhD programs who are not directly admitted to a doctoral program, but are judged to be potentially competitive for admission to a doctoral program (not necessarily at Harvard) after completing an MA degree in the RSEA program. Applicants who hold degrees from English-medium universities located outside of Asia are ineligible.
